In a story about falling in love and socking it to the Government, Edinburgh Fringe winner Sonya Kelly presents a tearfully funny and tender theatrical memoir about securing an Irish visa for her Australian partner, Kate. *How to Keep an Alien* opens at Auckland Arts Festival 2017 from 22-26 March.

Kelly meets a stage manager, Kate, while working together on a play being performed in an Irish castle. The attraction is mutual and eventually their "fling becomes a thing." But it's a tricky business having a relationship when you hail from opposite ends of the earth. It takes an Olympian will and the heart of a whale but, above all else, it takes paperwork. A hell of a lot of paperwork.

The winner of the 2014 Tiger Dublin Fringe Best Production award is a hilarious and madcap odyssey from the stony townlands of Ireland to the tropical depths of the Queensland bush as Sonya and Kate take on 'the visa people' and travel the long and winding road of bureaucracy to prove their love.

Clever, open-hearted and with just the right amount of TMI, *How to Keep an Alien* should be on every theatre-lover's Auckland Arts Festival 2017 to-do list.
